Scope of medical coverage	Basic coverage such as doctor and hospital visits relating to unexpected illnesses or emergencies.	Basic coverage such as doctor and hospital visits.	Secondary coverage for prescriptions, dental and other medical services.
Application process	No application, automatically enrolled once you register in courses. Valid for the term (e.g. Sept. 1 – December 31).	Must apply as soon as you arrive in BC with completed application and copy of your study permit (and family member's documents). See "International and US" section for more details.	No application, automatically enrolled in January or September for 8 months or 12 months respectively. Students beginning their studies in May can enroll in the plan for four months (see link below).
Obtain proof of coverage	Pick up your GMe card from the International Services for Students office in MBC 1200, Burnaby during the first week of classes.	After applying, a CareCard or Services Card will be mailed to you.	Download proof, "pay direct card" from link below.
Opt-out option	Yes, opt out online after receiving MSP by deadline (see link below). You may be eligible for a refund if you have more than 1 month left in the term have not used the plan.	No available opt out process	Yes, if you are covered by an equivalent, independent policy. Opt out online by deadline via link below.
