Quantum Leap: Reimagining the Workforce of the Future

The Army is focusing on developing new skills in its information technology force through an initiative called "Quantum Leap," according to the service's Chief Information Officer (G-6). Through Quantum Leap, the Army wants its 15,000 civilian IT workforce to shift its focus from certifications to a focus on skills to "reimagine the workforce of the future," Lt. Gen. Bruce Crawford said at a July 14 virtual AFCEA event.

PROBLEM STATEMENT:

Army's IT workforce does not have the skills required to support emerging technologies nor the agility to develop and employ talent to meet changing requirements.

GOAL:

Re-code and Up-skill 1,000 existing IT positions between now and FY23
