

CEO's Note

In 2021, the once in a lifetime challenges to our global interdependence became operationalized. We came to recognize our closest colleagues as much by their Zoom backgrounds as their faces and voices. It was a year in which the miracle of new vaccine science served as hope for many, and as further evidence of the deep inequalities in human society for the billions of people unable to access these vaccines.

Supply chain failures showed us the fragility of global markets. More pronounced though were the disruptions in the supply chain of human compassion and tolerance. We felt this impact as functional democracy retreated around the world. In my country of residence, the United States, the first week of 2022 saw an attempt to violently stop the congressional obligation to certify the votes cast in the 2020 presidential election.

From Meedan's vantage point, we see a common thread—and a foundational challenge—running through all of these themes. Undergirding vaccine hesitancy, democratic decay, and climate change denial is the continuing rise of misinformation in our digital public and private spaces.

In 2021, our small but mighty team—pre-wired for remote, global work—expanded our work across all program areas. Our Digital Health Lab team's work on the Vaccine Media Hub brought vaccine science to journalists and fact-checkers around the world; the Check Global team supported creative global partners and implemented global election media monitoring and fact-checking programs; the Meedan

research team published five peer-reviewed publications and developed a major initiative, Co·Insights, with US National Science Foundation support. Our product team brought Check tiplines to maturity as a best-in-class solution for running collaborative fact-checking initiatives on WhatsApp and other messaging services; and our engineering team developed and deployed multilingual, multimodal claimmatching AI.

As a bridge between global civil society, journalism, and platforms, Meedan is making good on a project we started fifteen years ago to have an impact at the scale of the web. We did all of this with a continued commitment to a <u>set of values</u> that has served as a compass and inspiration for all of these efforts.



"In her opening, Gyenes said it is important to reduce stigma in conversations about health misinformation.

"We've all heard health misinformation or vaccine rumors referred to as outlandish, but we really want to start by phrasing that it isn't an 'us and them' issue — it's something that affects everyone," Gyenes said.

Combating health misinformation, Gyenes said, requires activism across different fields. To that end, she highlighted the diverse academic backgrounds of the panelists.

"We have a demographer, an anthropologist and disinformation researcher, a communications researcher in this conversation," Gyenes said. "Hopefully we can build off of one another and we can really try to strengthen and improve our responses to health information and equity.""

"New Facebook partnership tackles health misinformation (Axios)

Facebook has announced that it is working with Meedan, a tech nonprofit, to help its fact-checking partner organizations combat health and vaccine misinformation. The new program comes in the wake of criticism that Facebook is not doing enough to curb misinformation about COVID-19 vaccines. Meedan will offer virtual training sessions to third-party fact-checkers on how to spot and correct misinformation. The partnership will also allow Facebook's fact-checking partners to access Meedan's health experts whenever they need immediate help with a fact-check. Facebook has spent \$84 million in the last four years supporting fact-checking efforts on the platform, but does not police misinformation on its own."

Full Fact: Towards a common definition of claim matching



"One project of Meedan (Kazemi et al 2021) matches WhatsApp tips with Indian fact checks across 5 languages. If an incoming tip matches a published fact check, then the fact check can be automatically sent out as a reply, potentially slowing the spread of misinformation.

V = fact checks from several organizations U = tips from WhatsApp users This automation maximizes response times while minimising costs.

Paraphrase detection: Sometimes, two matching claims may differ by only a few words that share meanings (i.e. synonyms), or they may be formed from the same phrases expressed in a different order. But in other cases, matching claims may be expressed in arbitrarily different ways, and even in different languages, such as with Meedan's work mentioned above, limiting the value of paraphrase detection as a complete solution."

"The researchers partnered with Meedan, a San Francisco-based non-profit that focuses on improving the quality and equity of online information, to develop their modules. They also worked with the University of Madras and TATA Institute of Social Sciences to recruit journalism students in India and with the Press Institute of India and 101 Reporters to recruit journalists in India.




Staff numbers

We grew our core team from 14 to 29 (108% growth), along with more than 10 part-time contractors.




Leadership

We developed a new leadership team structure of 10 leaders, of whom 2 are C-Suite executives, 3 are non-voting executives, and 5 are directors.




Equity, Diversity & Inclusion - Geography






