UTAH'S PUBLIC LANDS are renowned for their natural beauty. CNHA works in partnership with threee land management agencies.


The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) manages 22 million acres of land in Utah and Colorado with multiple recreation opportunities, including fishing, hiking, camping, and motorized vehicle use. Commercial activities, such as mining, grazing and forestry are common in this area. Conservation of plants, wildlife, habitat, and archaeological sites are included in the BLM mission.

The U.S. Forest Service (USFS), administers 8 million acres of land in Utah for multiple uses and for sustainable yield of renewable resources (water, forage, wildlife, wood) and recreation. It is the largest forestry research organization in the world.

The National Park Service (NPS) administers 2 million acres at 13 sites in the southeast Utah region. Its mission is to conserve scenery, wildlife, and natural and historic objects, while providing public enjoyment and leaving the land unimpaired for future generations.


