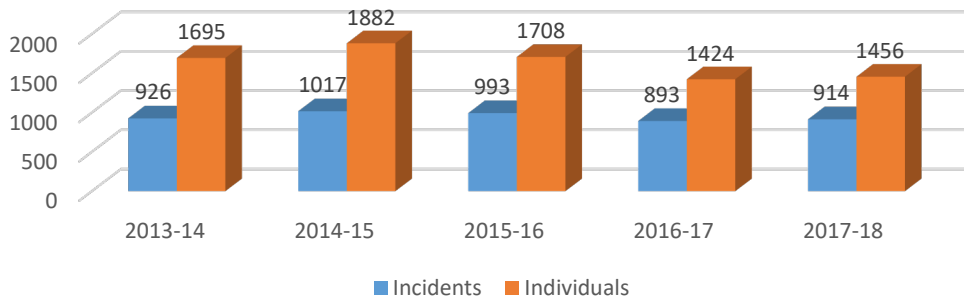

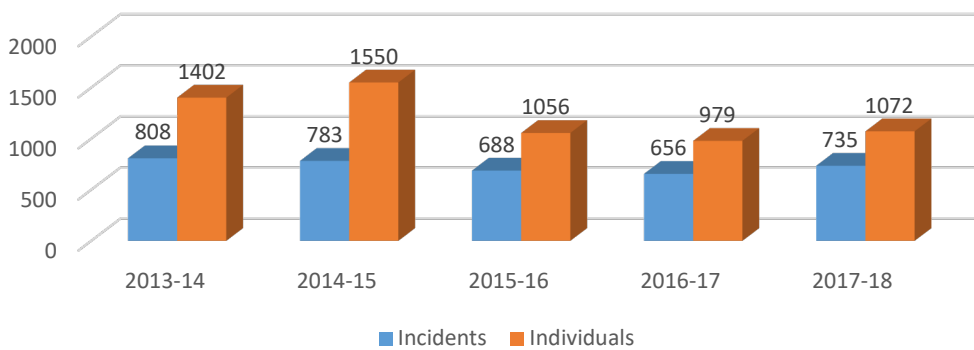
### Individual Referrals and Incidents: Five Year Comparison



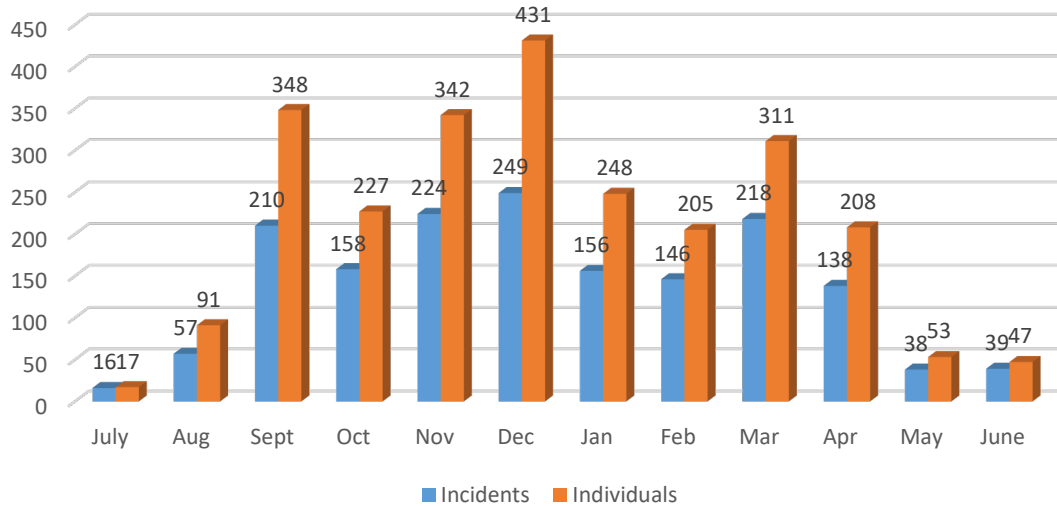
### Individual Referrals and Incidents: Fall Five Year Comparison



### Individual Referrals and Incidents: Spring Five Year Comparison

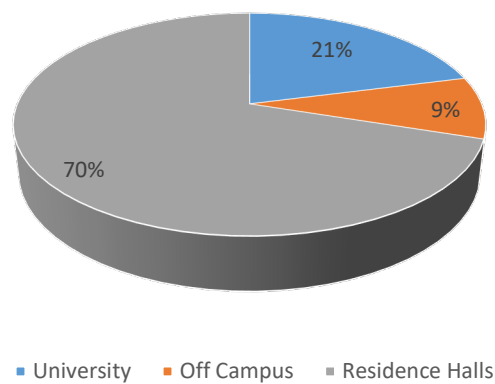


### Number of Individual Referrals and Total Incidents By Month for 2017-18

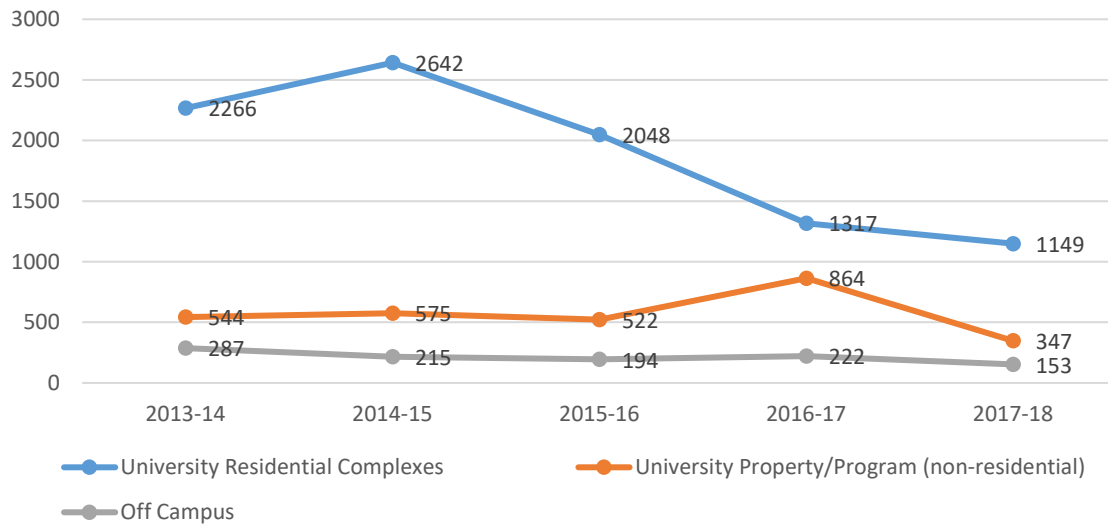

#### Percentage of Individual Referrals by Location: 2017-18

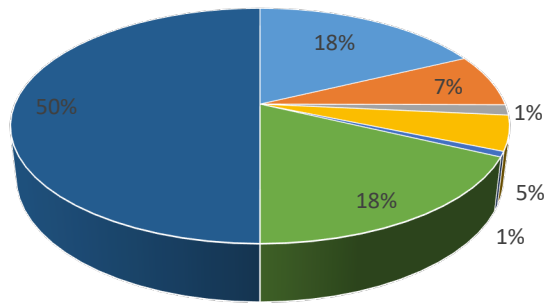


### Zone Summary of Number of Individuals: Five Year Comparison

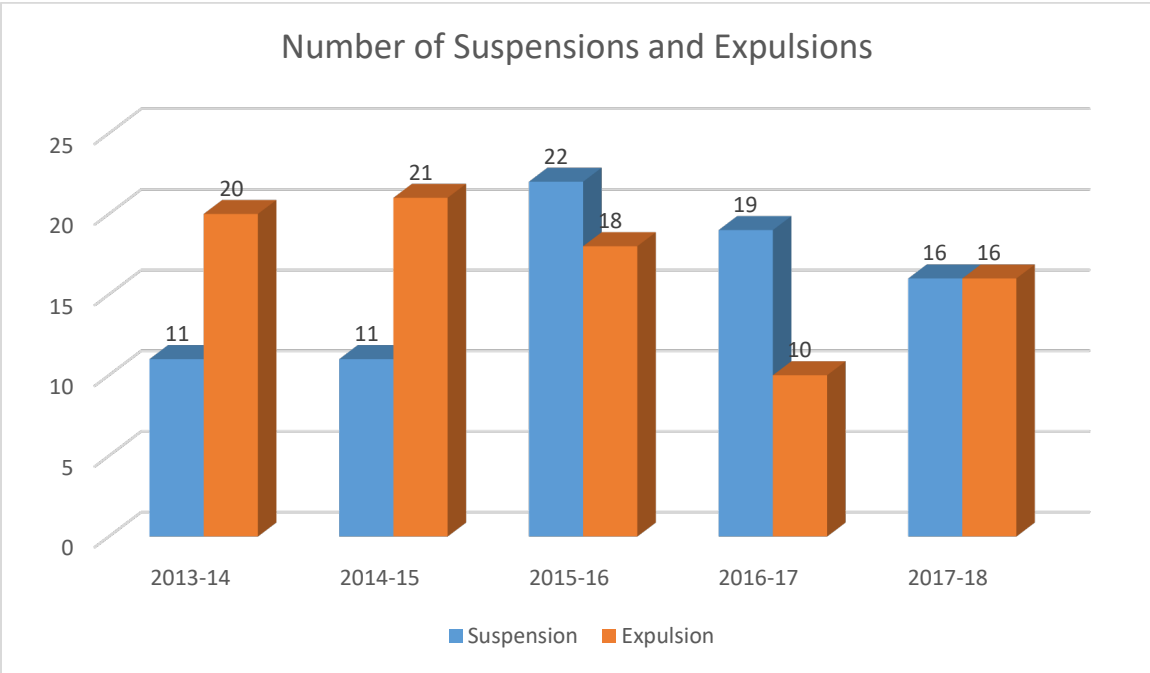
