

#### **Notes:**

Dates on the timeline refer to the year they wrote the source in question; dates above are their birth and death.

The four names from the list that do not appear on the timeline are: **Thallus** - the dates of his life are unknown, but he is believed to have written c. mid 2nd century, as is **Phlegon** (c.140's AD). **Hippolytus** was probably born in the later 2nd century; he was active in the 3rd century and died c. 235. Very little is known about Syrian **Mara Bar-Serapion** apart from the contents of his single surviving letter; dates for its composition range from as early as 73 C.E. to as late as 300 C.E.

### Manuscripts - or Pieces of Manuscripts?

Metzger saves a tiny scrap of John's Gospel, the Rylands Library Papyrus P52, for last. Even though P52 is the earliest piece of any book of the New Testament we have, it is so tiny we can scarcely make any pronouncements on just what its text says or how much it matches our Gospel of John – the entire text could sit upon a credit card and contains no complete sentences, and only one complete word (see below). Besides which, P52 only goes back to some uncertain point in the mid-second century c. 150 C.E., possibly even later. Scraps like this are not datable any more precisely than a 75 year window. Carbon dating is not accurate enough, so we can only judge by the script style, and we can't say precisely when a particular script style was in fashion.<sup>28</sup>
