 With focus in the Document Details pane, cannot use the keyboard to get to Summary, Edit, PDF links.
- Cannot use the keyboard to get to the Attach File or Attach PDF buttons.
- Cannot use the keyboard to access the Save button while in edit mode. No obvious work-around.
- With the (sometimes) exception of the 'Attach file' button, there are no interactive controls in the Document Details pane that are keyboard accessible.
- User is unable to Tab to large, chunky utility icons—Citation, New Reference, Share Group, Export References, Search the Web, Create a WoS Citation Report—in several places throughout the application, including the All References list. There does appear to be a work-around accessing the menus, or if basic search is on
- Reference List:
 - With an external search running, the user sees a progress meter. However there is no corresponding auditory feedback. Additionally, Pause and Cancel links are not keyboard accessible while the search is running.
- In the left navigation, button (+) to create a new tag is not accessible via keyboard, the hot key of 'enter' is also not clear.
- After running a reference search: User is unable to use the keyboard tabbing to:
 - > Access the button to 'add selected references to library'.
 - > Access table pagination.
 - Access links to Cancel or Pause the search.

There is a work around to move through each part of the content individually to get past a keyboard trap.

 Most Insert Fields functionality does not work with the keyboard.

- When search is complete, visual focus of the results table is at the bottom. Even a sighted user using keyboard would not see focus, would need to know to 'page up.'
- Styles > Sort Order (auth and bib)
 The Title for the 'Other Sort options' should make it clear you are in the 'other' option. It also just keeps coming back, really hard to get it to go away.
- Cannot create nested groups using the keyboard and modal dialog. You can do it with your mouse/cursor . . . drag and drop. Instructions may help.
- My Tags is missing label.
- The Create Tag window should have a label and name. (It's a table.)
- Create Tag . . . needs a label. It's the color tag create list.
- Tables don't all have a meaningful label and name. They should.
- EndNote has both content and presentation tables
- Global: Make sure every control / interactive element in a table has a label.
- Navigating items layed out with tables can be come tricky, like in the advanced search pane
- Add / Remove row buttons on Advance Search read just 'Button'. Need to be more precise with these labels. Good practice to provide meaningful, accurate Label / Name pairs for all interactive elements. Exception example: Add / Remove row buttons on Advance Search read just 'Button'.
- Details Close button not labeled.
- New Reference modal dialog. Fields have no labels.
- Not clear how to make multiple selections from a References results list.
