7	Purpose of the processing	The data is processed to identify, select and manage remote referees (RRs) that evaluate proposals submitted to calls published by the European Research Council. RRs are independent experts who remotely perform individual assessments of proposals preselected in step 1 of the ERC evaluation process, and are not reimbursed. RRs are identified and nominated for each individual proposal by ERC evaluation panels (made up of ERC panel members) during step 1 of the evaluation. In nominating RRs, panels can draw upon the global pool of experts, i.e. they are not limited to experts that have registered themselves in the central expert repository of the European Commission, EMPP.
		Actors and actions:
		Members of the ERC peer review evaluation panels (Panel members): Independent experts supporting the ERCEA in the peer review evaluation; in the frame of this data processing record, they suggest RRs with the necessary expertise to perform individual assessments of proposals.
		Chair-persons of the ERC peer review evaluation panels (Panel chairs): Independent experts that organise the work within their panel and chair panel meetings; in the frame of this data processing operation, they formally nominate RRs to perform individual assessments of proposals.
		ERCEA staff: In charge of manually encoding the identification information of RRs provided by panel members and panel chairs. ERCEA staff are also complementing this information with contact information (email address) from publicly available sources such as institutional websites and publication databases in order to send e-mail invitations, to issue letters of appointment and to allocate assessment tasks to RRs.
		Head of the ERCEA Scientific Management Department: Signs the letters of appointment of RRs on behalf of the agency.
