Through Extension experts and resources, Nebraskans have what they need to make well-informed decisions related to their surroundings, their health, their families, and their hometowns. Nebraska Extension is an integral partner in helping Nebraska live up to its well-earned reputation as "The Good Life."

- Over 440,000 Nebraskans attended educational programs or called local Extension professionals over 26,400 hours to their for their horticulture, insect, pest management, and other landscape environment related questions.
- The Nebraska 4-H Special Garden Urban Entomologists promoted Project distributed 1925 packets of Rubenza Cosmos seeds to Nebraska youth in 81 of 93 counties.
- Nebraska Extension Master **Gardener Volunteers donated** local communities in 2022. This equates to \$725,321 or 13 full-time Extension Educator positions.
