

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) imposes ludicrous and unnecessary rules. For example, its radiological exposure standards are 100 times stricter than EPA rules for air pollution exposure. The NRC's process for approving new designs is mind-numbingly complex. It took one company six years to get the green light for an SMR design. Another notable SMR project was canceled because of regulatory foot-dragging.

Chef German Rizzo and his wife, Kristin, have created a simple delight with Mediterranean-influenced small tasting plates and tapas-style dishes. The menu is separated into Garden, Board, Butcher, Sea and Carb. The millefeuille of aubergine is luscious layers of eggplant, tomato, creamy burrata and basil. The mushroom tart has mushrooms swimming in a Parmigiano fondue. The briquet croquette is filled with mascarpone and brisquet on a bed of apple compote.
