DUAL CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES WITH AREA HIGH SCHOOLS

Southwest Tech partners with local high schools to offer dual credit opportunities for students allowing for a seamless transition from secondary to post-secondary education. At this time, Southwest Tech currently offers the following dual credit opportunities:

ADVANCED STANDING

High school course that meets the competencies of a technical college course. Students earning a B or better are awarded the course credit upon enrollment in a program at the technical college.

TRANSCRIPTED CREDIT

College-level course taught by a WTCS certified high school instructor at the high school during the traditional school day. Student receives technical college credit upon completion of the course.

START COLLEGE NOW

Program established by the State of Wisconsin that allows high school juniors and seniors to enroll in technical college courses that are not comparable to courses offered at the high school.

COLLEGE UP

A program established through a partnership between Southwest Tech and CESA #3 allowing students to earn a technical diploma or portions of an associate degree program while still enrolled in high school.

38.14 CONTRACTED COURSES

Southwest Tech courses taught face-to-face at the high school or virtually by Southwest Tech faculty at a time that will work within the high school schedule.



TRANSCRIPTED CREDIT & ADVANCED STANDING

In the 2021-2022 school year, 25 school districts had agreements with Southwest Tech for transcribed credit or advanced standing courses.

Students are able to apply their transcribed credit or advanced standing by enrolling in programs at Southwest Tech following high school graduation. In the fall of 2022, 195 students with transcribed credit enrolled in programs with 40 of these students continuing in the same program of study as their transcribed credit courses.

Southwest Tech is no longer accepting new transcribed credit or advanced standing agreement requests; however, current agreements will continue to be honored as long as there is no change in instructor or curriculum. The following agreements were in place during the 2021-2022 school year. All agreements are transcribed credit unless noted as advanced standing.

DUAL CREDIT PARTICIPATION RECOGNITION

Southwest Tech recognizes the importance of partnerships with our area school districts providing dual credit opportunities to their high school students. Two awards programs have been established for this purpose:

Dual Credit Excellence Award

This newly established annual award recognizes the top four performing school districts for largest percentage increase from the previous year for students enrolling in the dual credit programs of ColLEDGE Up, Start College Now, and 38.14 contracted courses. Each of the four districts receives a monetary award provided by an anonymous Foundation donor. The designated monetary awards are #1: \$5,000, #2: \$2,500, #3: \$1,500, and #4: \$1,000.

To determine the overall percentage increase or decrease, the number of unduplicated students enrolled in ColLEDGE Up, Start College Now and 38.14 contracted courses is divided by the total number of high school students for the given year, and the previous year percentage is subtracted from the current year percentage.

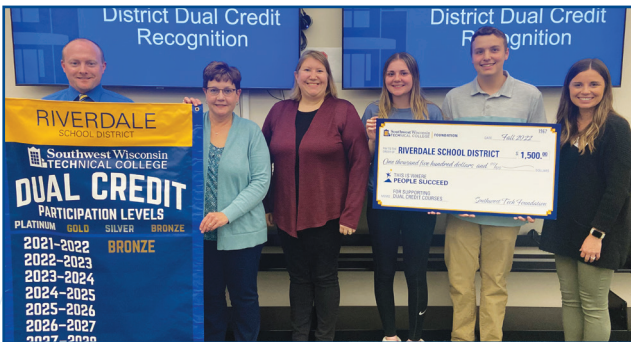

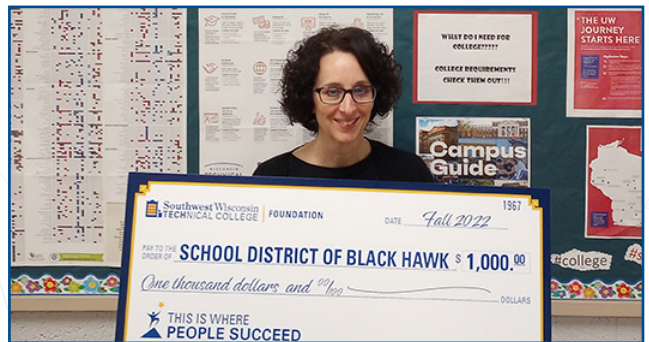

Dual Credit Participation Level Award

This annual award recognizes school districts for participating in two or more dual credit programs of COLLEGE Up, Start College Now, 38.14 contracted courses, and transcribed credit and the overall percentage of high school students enrolled in dual credit programs during a given school year. The number of unduplicated students enrolled in dual credit programs is divided by the total number of high school students. Districts achieving recognition are provided with a banner to display in their school building along with a graphic to display on their website or social media page.

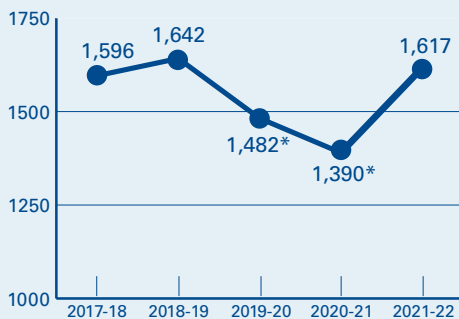

5-YEAR OVERVIEW OF TOTAL UNDUPLICATED DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENT PARTICIPATION

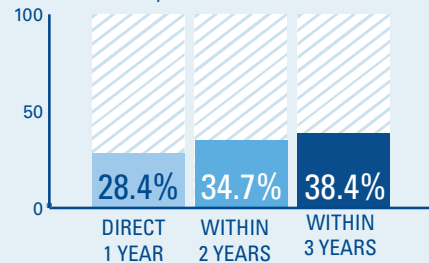

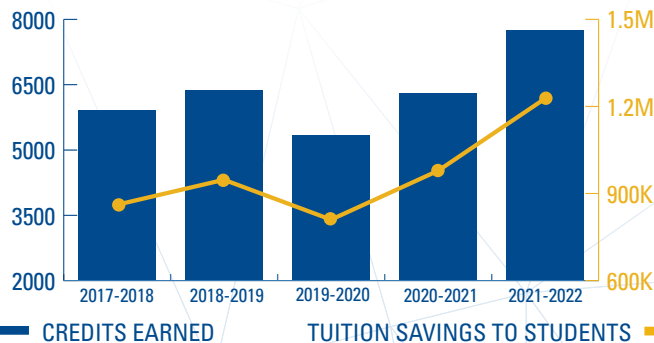

The Start College Now program is an opportunity for students in grades 11 and 12 currently enrolled in a Wisconsin public high school to attend a Wisconsin technical college for the purpose of taking one or more courses to earn credit toward a high school diploma and a college degree at the same time.

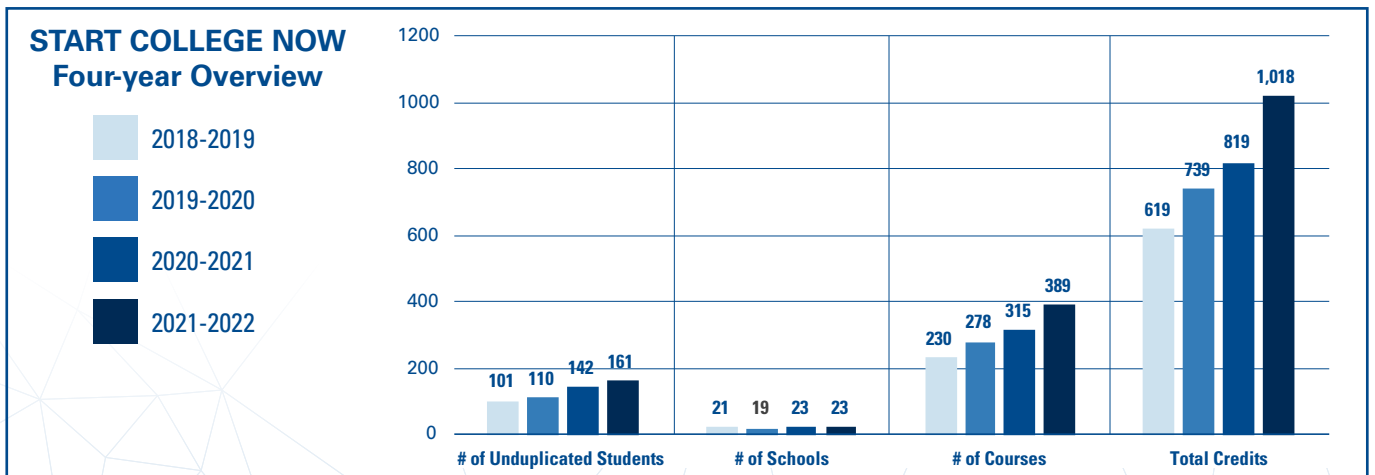

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COLLEDGE UP

The ColLEDGE Up program was established through a partnership with **CESA #3** as well as **Southwest Health Center** for the Nursing pathway and the **Wisconsin Department of Corrections** for the Criminal Justice Studies pathway. ColLEDGE Up allows students to earn a technical diploma or portions of an associate degree program while still enrolled in high school. Current pathways include:

- Gear up: Transferable General Education Courses
- Healthcare Careers
- 11-12-14 Nursing
- One and Done-Laboratory Science Technician
- Emergency Medical Technician (EMT)/ Firefighter
- Computer Numerical Control (CNC) Machine Operator/Programmer
- Pistons to Pathways Automotive

New pathway areas of Education and Criminal Justice Studies have been developed to begin in 2022-2023.

In the 2021-2022 school year, a total of 186 unduplicated students were enrolled in a total of 590 courses totaling 1,284 post-secondary credits.

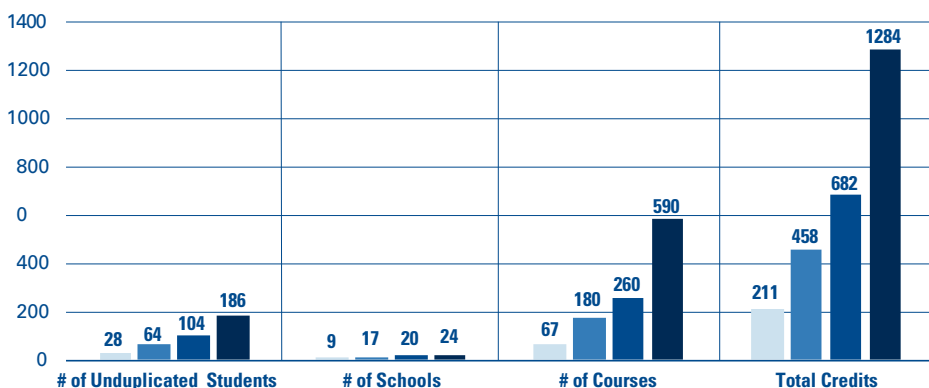

118.15 COMPULSORY EDUCATION

Since the enactment of Wisconsin State Statute 118.15 Compulsory School Attendance, Southwest Tech has been committed to providing this service for area high schools. Through a contract initiated by their local high school, students may participate in a program that assists them in earning a state-issued high school diploma.

For program eligibility, a student must be age 17 or older, one year (minimum) behind their class in credits earned, at a minimum 9th grade reading level, and at-risk status.

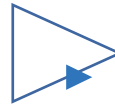
