



## **DISCOVERIES and DISCOVERIES Reports** **Format of Editorial manuscripts**

Editorials present viewpoints of the editors, comment on a specific article previously published in Discoveries or Discoveries Reports, or are related to other scientific topics (such as politics of science).

Length of editorials is limited to 4000 words (excluding abstract, references and figure legends). We do NOT require a cover letter for submission

### **Title Page:**

- Title
- Authors & affiliations
- Corresponding author's institutional address/ phone/ fax/ e-mail

### **Abstract:**

A small abstract of maximum 160 words is allowed (but not mandatory).

### **Keywords and the list of the Abbreviations**

Please provide at least 2 keywords.

### **Bullet points:**

One or more bullet points are not required but recommended.

### **Main Text**

Maximum length of an editorial is 4000 words (excluding abstract, references and figure legends).

### **Display Items**

There is no minimum requirement for the number of display items. Editorials should not have more than 3 display items (pictures and tables). Supplementary information is allowed if needed.

To expedite the submission process, only one file (in “.pdf” (preferred) or “.doc” format) should be submitted. All display items (including figures) have to be inserted in the main text or at the

end of the manuscript when submitted (not in separate files). If the manuscript is accepted we will need and ask for figures to be provided in separate files, in .jpg or .tiff format.

## References

A maximum of 75 references are permitted (exceptions may apply in specific cases). References follow the *Vancouver* format (when using EndNote, please follow the “Cell Death and Disease” journal reference style: <http://endnote.com/downloads/style/cell-death-disease>). For more than 6 authors, please use “et al.” as in the following example:

*Example:*

Gerard KR, Gerd B, Johnson F, Erik AS, Deiry JK, Saez R et al. A novel small molecule inhibits protein X activation inducing necroptosis. *Discoveries Rep.* 2013; 3: 113-118.

We also recommend including the DOI number at the end of each reference.
