Community Forms is located on the TAXI campus in Denver's Globeville neighborhood near the South Platte River. The artwork consists of a collection of form concrete structures that can serve as gathering spots and a place for free-form play. The design also serves to redirect runoff water from rainstorms or snowmelt toward a bio-swale that slowly releases into the river. There also is interpretive signage in place describing the history of flooding on the South Platte River and how individuals can be better prepared for future floods.
