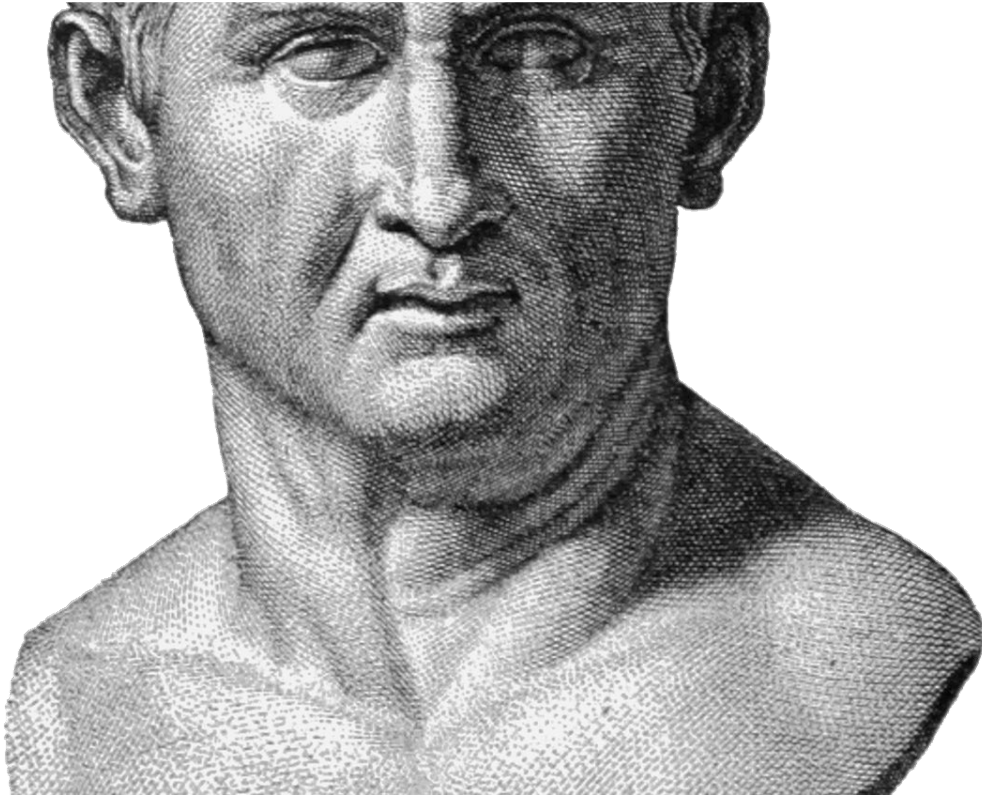
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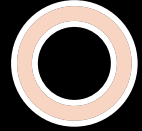
Terminology Matters

Getty Vocabularies Project


•"Catherine wheel or rose window? Cohuacalco or Snake House? Gaochang or Qara-Hoja? Getty Vocabularies are structured resources for the visual arts domain, including art, architecture, decorative arts, other cultural works, archival materials, visual surrogates, and art conservation. Compliant with international standards for structured and controlled vocabularies, they provide authoritative information for catalogers, researchers, and data providers."



Getty Provenance Index

- A large-scale database of provenance records regarding the sale and inventory of works of art. It digitizes many thousands of records (22,000 sales catalogues, for example), containing information on millions of records (1.8 million sales, for instance).
- Currently, in the midst of a large-scale transformation of data from a traditional relational database model to a linked open data (LOD) model.

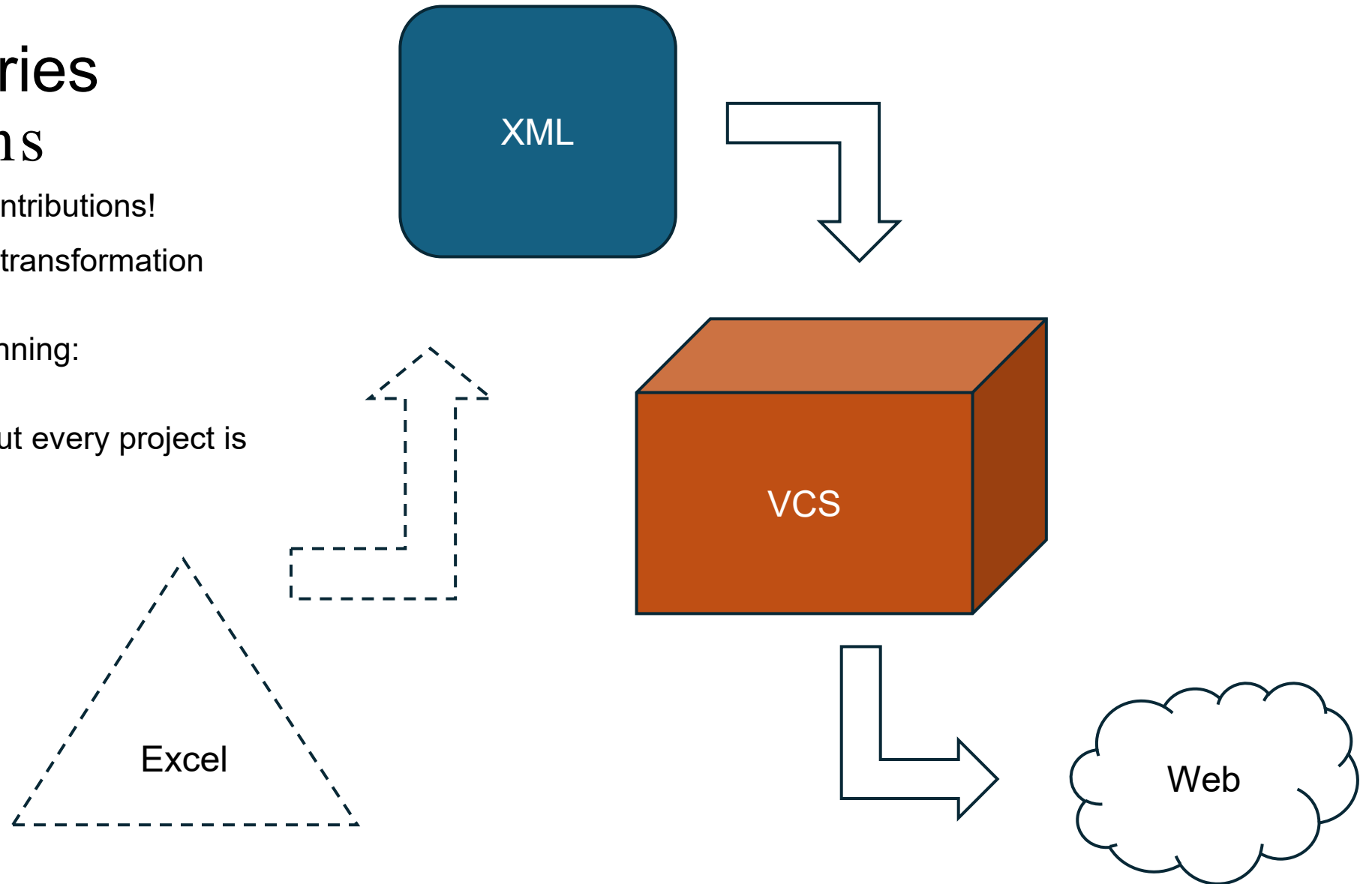

1. Vocabularies Contributions

- We welcome your contributions!
- Straightforward data transformation pipeline
- Except the very beginning: Contributions
- Excel is standard—but every project is a little different



Blacksmithing Data

- Hammering Excel data into well-formed XML
- Problems (i.e., “did you, the contributor, do one of the following?”):
 - Leave a space after a column name?
 - Slightly misspell the name of the column?
 - Include more of a value than is allowed in our presets?
 - Include values in your data that are not already present in Getty Vocabularies?
- Problems (i.e., “are we, the staff at Getty Vocabs, doing this the best way?”):
 - Our smiths: Antonio Beecroft, Jonathan Ward
 - Uh-oh. Unsynchronized data
 - Whoops! Non-version controlled, bespoke software
- Solutions
 - Github
 - Standardized documentation, workflow



2. CDWA on Quire

- Categories for the Description of Works of Art (CDWA)
- A basic resource for scholars in the art historical, curation, and museums space
- Updating the platform:
 - HTML to Quire
 - Website to online publication
 - Increasing legibility and navigability
- Emily Benoff did 99.9% of the work on this transformation

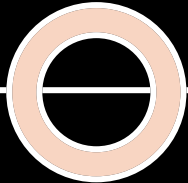
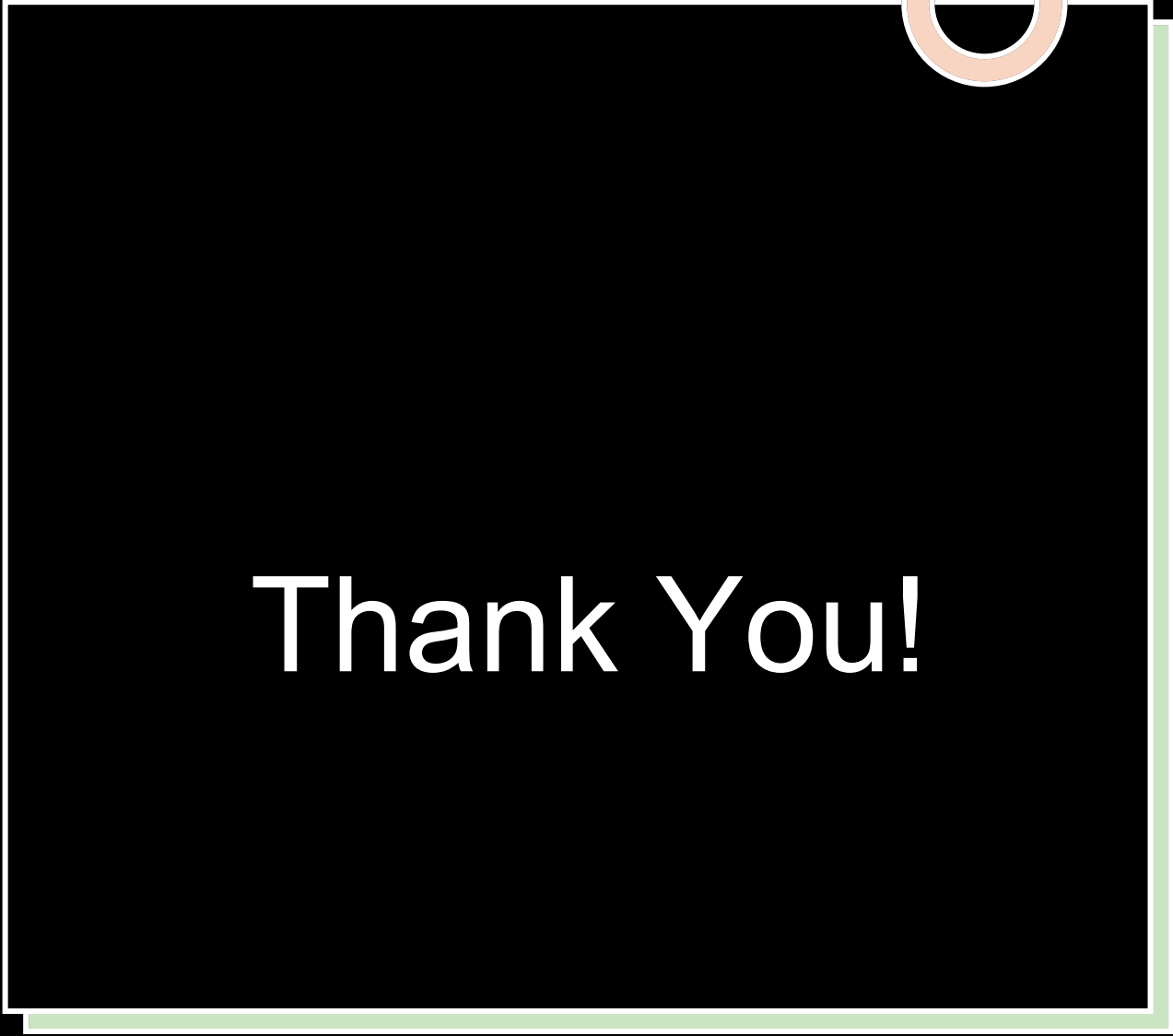
