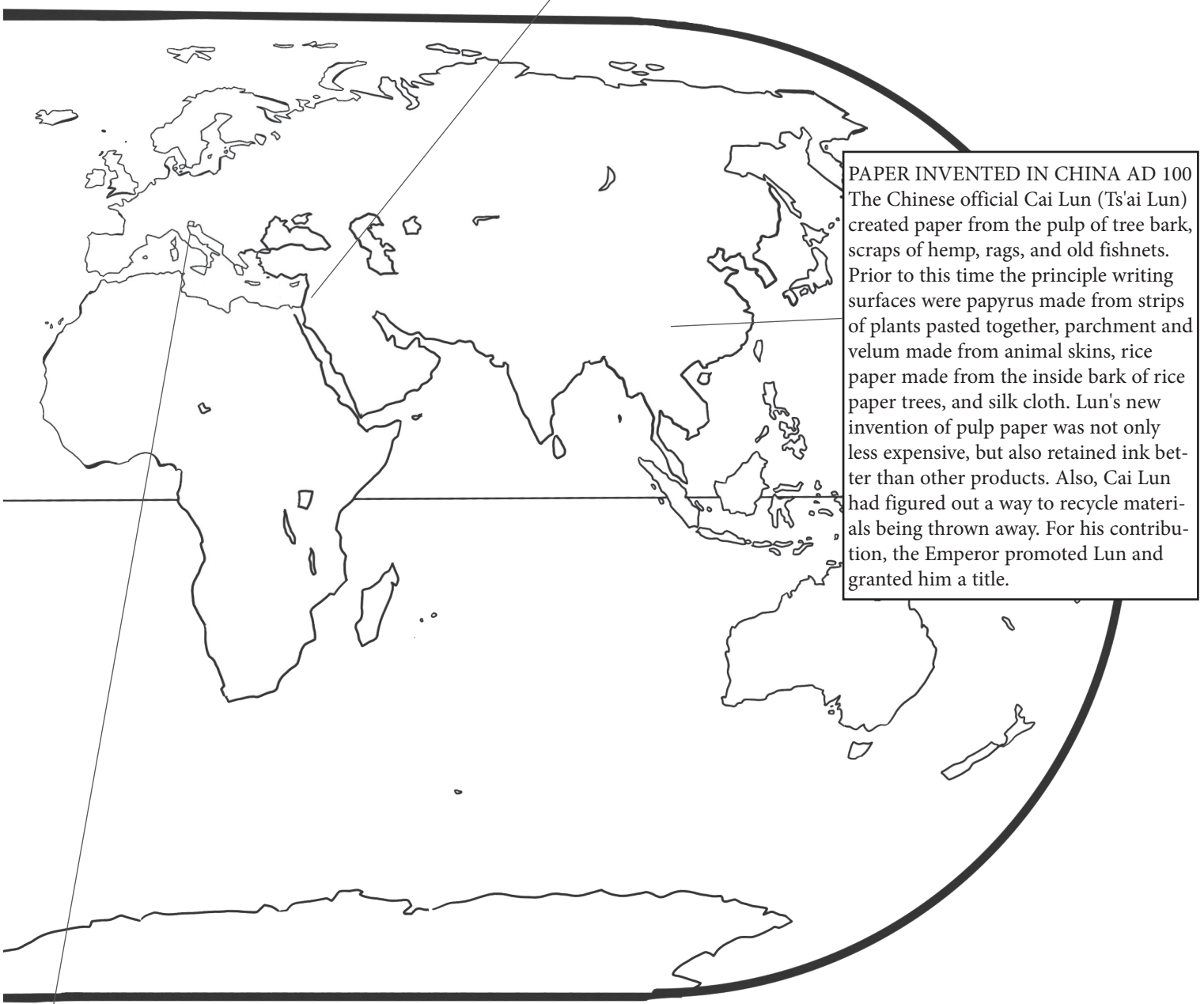
MAYA EMPIRE

The Maya civilization, beginning c. 300 BC, reached its height around AD 250.

They developed a hieroglyphic writing system similar to Egypt. They were excellent mathematicians and invented an accurate yearly calendar. You can still visit a pyramid they built in Chichen Itza, Mexico.

JESUS AND THE EARLY CHURCH

Jesus (which means "God saves") came to earth to save us from our sins. After His death and resurrection (about AD 30), early Christians began taking the good news to other parts of the Roman Empire. Within a hundred years, the message of Jesus had spread to Europe and Africa and Asia. Everywhere Christians went they told others the Good News about Jesus Christ and how they could be forgiven of sin.

**PAPER INVENTED IN CHINA AD 100**

The Chinese official Cai Lun (Ts'ai Lun) created paper from the pulp of tree bark, scraps of hemp, rags, and old fishnets. Prior to this time the principle writing surfaces were papyrus made from strips of plants pasted together, parchment and velum made from animal skins, rice paper made from the inside bark of rice paper trees, and silk cloth. Lun's new invention of pulp paper was not only less expensive, but also retained ink better than other products. Also, Cai Lun had figured out a way to recycle materials being thrown away. For his contribution, the Emperor promoted Lun and granted him a title.

ROMAN EMPIRE 31 BC — AD 476

The Roman Empire began with the rule of Caesar Augustus in 31 BC, divided between East and West in AD 395, and finally ended with the fall of the city of Rome in AD 476.

The ancient Romans were the first civilization to build large, permanent bridges. The bridges were a key component in their military expansion, allowing troops to be moved quickly. Roman bridges were famous for using arches in their construction. The development of the arch and piers to support arches allowed longer bridges to be built. Some bridges that were built by the Romans are still standing today.

 and he must win the battle.



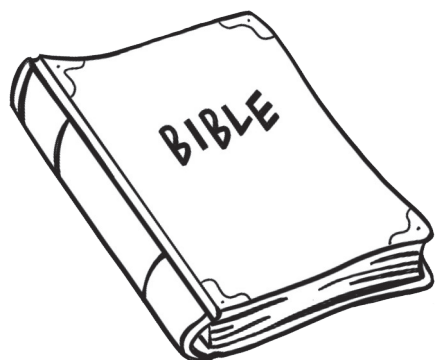
And though this *world*, with devils filled,

 his kingdom is forever!

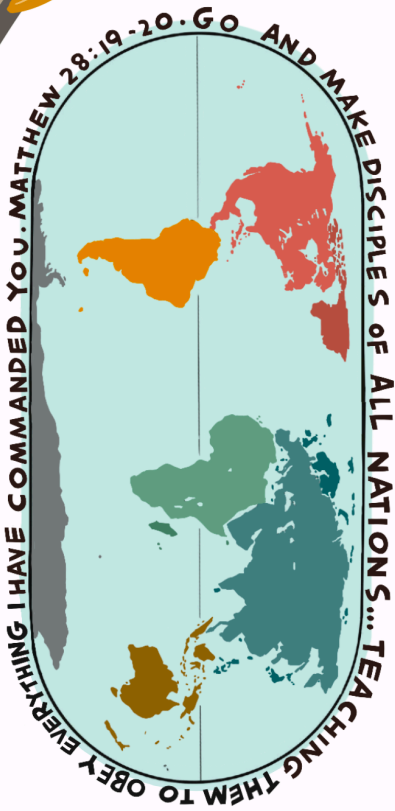
