ODVN Opposed to Revised Version of H.B. 14, the "Equal Parenting" Bill

Legislators have been asked to consider a revised version of H.B. 14, the equal parenting time and responsibilities bill. The bill is currently in the House Families and Aging Committee.

The sponsors hoped to address opponents' concerns with H.B. 14. However, ODVN and more than 90 organizations remain opposed. We have made it clear to the sponsors and the proponents of the bill that we will not support any proposal that creates a presumption of equal parenting and puts the rights of parents over the best interest of a child. State Issues

Status on Priority Bills

The House will return to session on January 10th, and the Senate's first session date is on January 24th.

This year, <u>ODVN's legislative priorities</u> will be centered around two key pillars: reducing domestic violence fatalities and enhancing child safety within the family court system.

H.B. 14: Presumption of Equal Parenting

Time and Responsibilities Opposed

Hearing in the House Families and Aging Committee on 11/28 and substitute bill introduced.

H.B. 111:

Felony Domestic Violence Sentencing Support

This bill, which increases sentences for felony domestic violence crimes, passed unanimously in the House on 12/13. Introduced in the Senate on 12/19.

H.B. 161:

Eliminate Spousal Rape Exceptions Support

Passed in the House on 11/29. Referred to Senate Judiciary Committee on 12/6.

S.B. 100: Prohibit

Installation of Tracking Devices Support

1st Hearing in House Criminal Justice Committee on 10/17.

Federal Issues

Coalition For Health Funding Sign-On Letter

Over 650 organizations are asking Congress to reject a full-year continuing resolution and instead finish the FY24 appropriations process with the bipartisan Senate funding bills as a starting point for negotiations. For more information, please see this <u>fact sheet</u>.
