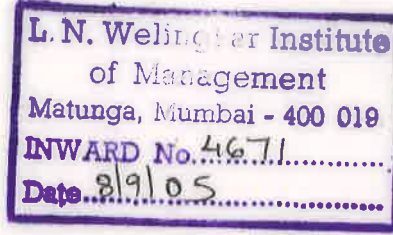

Sub:- Extension of approval for admitting students of Foreign Nationals/ PIO/ Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries, under 15% supernumerary quota to Prin.L.N.Welingkar Institute Of Management Development & Research, Lakhamsi Napoo Road, Next To R.A.Poddar College Of Commerce Matunga (East), Mumbai, 400 019 for academic year 2005-06.

Sir,

Pursuant to the Resolution No. 21-2/2003-TS-III dated June 1, 2004, issued Ministry of HRD, Department of Higher Education, Government of India and the AICTE Regulation No. 37-3/Legal/2004 dated 21st January, 2004, published in the Gazette of India Extraordinary (Part-III Sec. 4) and based on the information available, the AICTE has decided to grant permission to the institution indicated above for admitting the students under above categories in the following courses within 15% of supernumerary seats:

S.No.	Programme(s)
1.	MMS
2.	PGDBA

Kindly note, the institution(s) is entitled to admit the students under the above category and any other category/ quota including the students that may have been nominated by various government agencies as per the notification of MHRD, Government of India issued from time to time, provided all such admissions are adjusted within the maximum ceiling of 15% supernumerary seats.

Since the Ministry of HRD has dispensed with the practice of issuing the NOC for the students of above category, the institutions are required to ensure furnishing the complete list of students admitted by 30 September, 2005 each year, indicating the details of background of the students, the passport particulars, the fee being charged, their residential address, the country of origin, visa documents and such other documents as may be necessary to:

- (I) MHRD
- (II) AICTE
- (III) Ministry of External Affairs (students cell)
- (IV) Secretary Education/ DTE in the respective State/ UT.
- (V) The University concerned.

It shall be incumbent upon the institution concerned to ensure the bonafide of the students, their background and track records, ensuring the interest of the country and its security concerns. While the documents shall be submitted to AICTE merely for the purpose of information, it shall be responsibility of the concerned State Government to ensure meeting stipulation of Home Ministry and MEA, as may be applicable.

Further the institute is required to submit an undertaking to AICTE as per the format place at Annexure - A

The State Government may accordingly issue necessary instructions to the institution(s) and the agency concerned.

## UNDERTAKING

I ----- (Director/ Principal) hereby provide the following undertaking to the All India Council for Technical Education for the purpose of obtaining AICTE approval for admitting students of Foreign Nationals/PIO/Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries.

- (1) It is certified that the institution has adequate infrastructural and other facilities required for admission of Foreign Nationals/PIO/Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries as per the norms prescribed for the purpose by the Council and shall continue to maintain the same during the period of approval.
- (2) The institution shall ensure that the admission of students under this category are made strictly as per the notification issued by the AICTE vide notification No. 37-3/Legal/2004 dated 21<sup>st</sup> January, 2004 or any other subsequent notification that may come in force.
- (3) The students under this category shall be admitted on merit as per the guidelines prescribed by the concerned State Government/University. The institutions shall submit a list of students admitted under this category to the State Government/ Affiliating University/ AICTE/ Ministry of Human Resources Development / Ministry of External Affairs by end of December every year.
- (4) The institution shall charge fees prescribed by the concerned State Government/ University from the students admitted under this category. The amount of fees charged shall be in the form of foreign currency of the country from which the students originated and the details of foreign currency collected by way of fees shall be communicated to the concerned State Government/ University/

AICTE/ Ministry of Human Resources Development by end of December every year.

- (5) The passport details of every PIO / Foreign National shall also be made available to the organizations mentioned in (4) above.
- (6) The institution will seek approval from AICTE for continuation of approval for admission of Foreign Nationals/PIO/Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries etc., since the approval granted by the AICTE would be co-terminus with the approval for conduct of regular courses in the institution.
- (7) It is understood that 15% of the total intake is the maximum ceiling and un-utilized seats in this quota cannot be filled up with Indian students.
- (8) The Institutions shall be able to provide suitable hostels/ residential accommodation for the Foreign Students/ Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) and the Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries.
- (9) The teacher-student ratio in the respective discipline where Foreign Nationals / Persons of Indian Origin are to be admitted shall not be less than 1:15.
- (10) The institution shall provide a modern library as per norms & standards of AICTE with multi media facilities.
- (11) The total plinth area of the institution (excluding hostels and residential areas) shall be not less than 12.5 sq. mtrs. per student.

- (12) The Institution and it's hostels shall have proper approach road, good environment, sufficient water supply and an arrangement for generators in absence of normal supply of electricity.
  
- (13) The results (success rate) of last two batches of final year students shall not be less than 75%, calculated based on number of students appeared in the final examination, vis-à-vis the students passed.
  
- (14) In the event of infringement/ contravention or non-compliance of the regulations norms and standards as prescribed by the AICTE from time to time, the Council shall take action to withdraw approval and the liability arising out of such withdrawal of approval will be solely that of Management / Trust/ Society and/ or institution.
